a. This sermon is focused on being comfortable with sharing your personal story of the Holy Spirit awakening you to the gift of salvation in Christ Jesus.

#### 5. Eph 6:10-20 How to keep a prayer journal

- a. This sermon is about how to keep a prayer journal to spur on your prayer life.
- b. The effect of this journal is to see how often God answers prayer.


--Pray for all the volunteers giving their time to help those in need.

#### Welcome! Ryan & Kelcí Zevenbergen


I, Kelci, grew up in Rock Valley and my parents are Dale and Koni Kooima. I have one younger sister, Aubrey.

#### "The Song and the Story"

Although I enjoy good Christian music, I have never aspired to be a songwriter. Coming up with the words to fit a song is a task in and of itself not to mention putting those songs to notes and music that fit in the overall scheme of the song, concert, or playlist. I am thankful for writing ability and I admire those who can take that writing ability and turn it into music.

As I look at these two God-given abilities of writing music and writing stories. I see many similarities. Each of the writers is writing about a theme that sparks their interest, has played a role in the lives or is on their hearts and minds. We are using the talents and gifts that we've been given to tell what God has done, what he is doing and what he will do. Each person whether it be an author or artist is being led by God to proclaim his message.

I know that we are not alone in the opportunities that we have to tell our stories. There are millions of people today that have taken the opportunity to write as I have here or put to music words and thoughts that describe mountaintop experiences of their lives or deep and low valleys. They have written with a mix of emotions running through their mind, using the opportunities to turn to God in supplication, prayer and praise, pain, happiness, or whatever other emotion one can have or name.

I applaud those who have taken a step forward and told their story in various ways. If I haven't had the opportunity to hear your story yet, I pray that I may someday cross paths with your journey and get to hear about your story. It takes courage and determination to tell your story and even in the midst of its darkest moments God was there.

What is your song and story? There are some of us who still have yet to tell our stories or to sing the songs of our hearts. I trust and know that God will provide the opportunities for you to tell yours. While you wait, reflect on the goodness of God and where he has led you. This may also cause you to reflect on the hard moments, the missteps that may have been taken. Even in these, one can still see God at work.

There will come a day and an opportunity where your story can be told and ultimately can be a blessing to its hearers. In those moments, God will work through both speaker and listener for his glory and grace. In those moments, God can and will do great things through all of us. Praise him for the opportunity to tell our stories whether in written form or in song. Praise him for the work that he is doing, has done, and will continue to do in each of our lives until he comes again.

#### "Redeeming 'Wasted' Time"

In *Just Like Jesus*, Max Lucado writes that the average American spends a total of six months waiting at stoplights, eight months opening junk mail, 18 months looking for items we've lost and five years standing in line. All the while, many of us grumble: "What a waste of time! I could be doing something much more important! Where are my keys?"

But Lucado suggests that we give these moments to God. Rather than whispering to ourselves, we can speak to God in prayer. "Simple phrases such as 'Thank you, Father,' 'Be sovereign in this hour, O Lord,' 'You are my resting place, Jesus' can turn a commute into a pilgrimage," he writes. "You needn't leave your office or kneel in your kitchen. Just pray where you are. Let the kitchen become a cathedral or the classroom a chapel. Give God your whispering thoughts."

When we do this, "the common becomes uncommon," Lucado adds. What's more, "wasted" time becomes valuable; boring waits become meditative; the lost — your time, if not also your keys — is redeemed.

#### "Co-Laborers with Christ"

Rusty Stevens, a ministry leader in Virginia, described trying to finish mowing the lawn before dinnertime. His 6-year-old son darted in front of him and grabbed the mower handle. But when Stevens stopped pushing, the mower soon stopped.

The busy dad fought the urge to tell his son to get out of his way and instead offered to help. Stevens began pushing again, leaning over and walking awkwardly to accommodate his eager assistant.

Although the mowing commenced, it was slow-going and not as efficient as the solo effort.

That's when Stevens realized a ministry parallel: "This is the way my heavenly Father allows me to 'help' him build his kingdom!" The church leader pictured God busy "seeking, saving and transforming the lost, and there I was, with my weak hands 'helping."

Although God surely can tackle all the work of ministry and evangelism alone, he "chooses to stoop gracefully to allow me to co-labor with him," said Stevens. What a blessing and privilege that God lets us work alongside him!

#### "Lessons from Hiking"

Whether I'm hiking an easier stroll or a 20-mile trek, I've noticed parallels to my journey with Christ.

- This is my journey. Too often I waste time comparing my stride, pace or equipment to that of fellow hikers.
- I don't know what's around each bend, but God does. I can't let anxiety steal my joy.
- · It's best to balance hiking in silence with sharing the trail with friends.
- I'll be sore tomorrow, and that's okay. Engaging new muscles leaves a reminder that growth is uncomfortable.
- Being prepared is good; being too prepared makes for a heavy backpack. I need to do my due diligence and let God handle the rest.
- It's not a race, so finishing quickly offers no reward. When I'm not in a hurry, I tend to notice more of God's blessings.
- I need to look up, enjoying God's creation as I let him determine my steps.

#### "The Meaning of Membership"

Oklahoma pastor Ricky Jones tackles the meaning of church membership, or being part of Christ's body. "Leaving the church is not simply leaving a club," he writes at the Gospel Coalition website. "When you walk away, you dismember yourself from the body. Jesus and the rest of the body sorely miss you, and bleed after your departure. You cut yourself off from your only source of life and nourishment. Like an amputated hand, you will slowly bleed out, wither, and die."

Jones contends that "being a part of the universal church without submitting to a local church is not possible, biblical or healthy." It's impossible because you need to be part of a smaller community before you can be considered part of a greater community. It's unbiblical because the New Testament epistles are addressed to specific local churches. And it's unhealthy because wanting to independently make your own choices is "at the heart of sin," the pastor writes.

"You need to know we're all in this life together, and we won't walk away from you just because you let us down or we disagree," says Jones. "Together we build each other up into the image of Christ; no one can make it alone."
