“The Cost of Love: The History of Valentine’s Day”



February arrives with hearts in store windows and “love” in the air. For many, Valentine’s Day has become synonymous with chocolates, cards, and romantic dinners. Yet behind the commercial gloss stands a much richer and older story.

In the third century, the Roman Empire was not friendly to Christians. According to early tradition, Valentine was a bishop who served quietly but courageously under Emperor Claudius II. In an effort to end Christianity, the emperor forbid Christian marriage—believing unmarried soldiers would fight better. Most ministers complied but Valentine refused to comply. He continued to marry Christian couples in secret, affirming that marriage was not a tool of the state but a gift of God. Eventually, his faithfulness led to imprisonment and execution around AD 269.

Love, for Valentine, was not a feeling reserved for favorable circumstances. It was obedience to Christ expressed through courage, sacrifice, and care for others. This understanding of love stands in sharp contrast to our cultural assumptions. We often equate love with ease, comfort, or emotional fulfillment.

Love, we are told, should make life smoother, happier, and more enjoyable. When love becomes difficult, inconvenient, or demanding, we assume something must be wrong. But Christian love tells a different story. Scripture reminds us that “God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us” (Romans 5:8). Love, at its core, is self-giving.

Valentine’s story presses an important question upon the church: What kind of love shapes our lives? Is it the love that seeks self-protection, or the love that is willing to enter suffering? Love for Christians does not insist on rights; it lays them down. It does not calculate cost before obeying; it trusts the Father even when obedience leads to the cross.

Love is covenant faithfulness. Love is perseverance in prayer for one another. Love is forgiving when it would be easier to hold a grudge. Love is teaching our children the faith, visiting the lonely, bearing one another’s burdens, and confessing Christ openly.

As a congregation, we are called to embody this kind of love together in our worship, in our fellowship, and in our witness before a watching world.

So, when February 14 arrives, may we remember more than cards and candy. May we remember the Savior whom Valentine and all the faithful serve. The Lord Jesus, whose love cost everything, who now calls us to love one another as He has loved us.

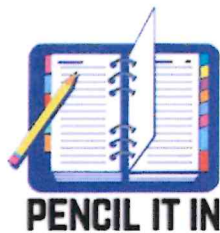

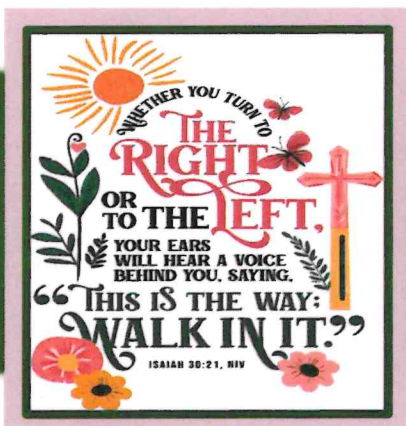
Church Family:

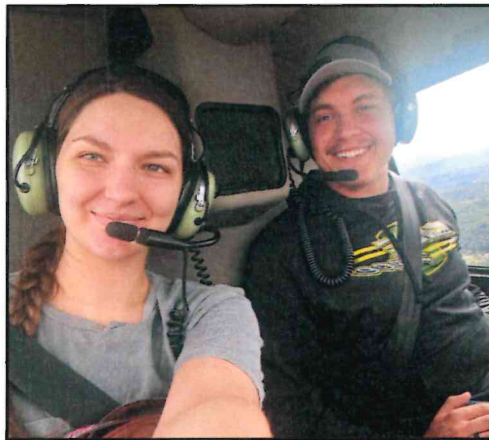
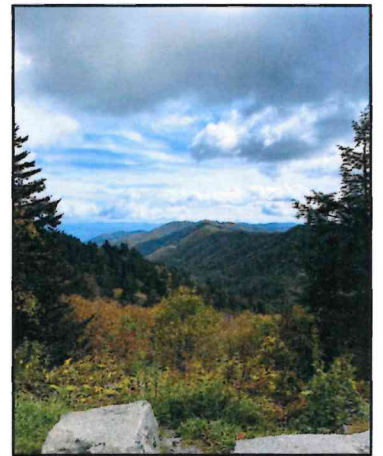
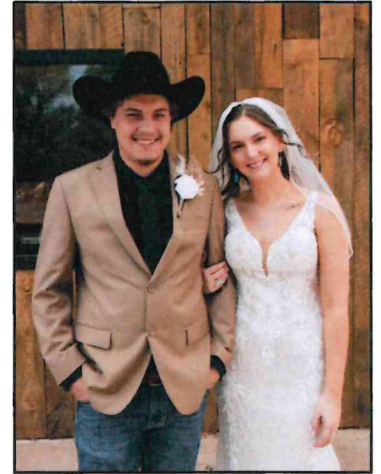
Austin & I got married on October 4, 2025, at First CRC in Rock Valley and the reception was at Prairie Winds Event Center in Orange City.

“Spring Cleaning for the Soul”

More personally, it is an opportunity to enter into a springtime for our spirit. For centuries Christians have used the 40 days of Lent to seek spiritual growth. Sincere repentance, a changing of heart, casting off old sinful practices and seeking to commune with our creator help us go in the right direction. Spending serious time in silence and prayer focuses our attention. Reading spiritual literature, becoming more knowledgeable about the New Testament, meeting in small groups with other Christians to share personal stories of faith can all be immensely stimulating. Joining with others to serve the helpless and hopeless can strengthen our spiritual life.

Lent is a time to let God do “spring cleaning” within us. It’s our opportunity to allow God to help us toss out the “stuff” that hinders us and then freshen up the “new creature” we are meant to be as followers of Christ.

“Stop , Look and Listen”

Why should we observe Lent?

We observe Lent because it causes us to STOP.

Lent says, “Stop and rest awhile.” Lent says, “Stop doing wrong.”

We observe Lent because it tells us to LOOK.

Look inward for an honest self-examination.

Look upward to see the cross of Christ with healing and love.

Look forward to the hope of the Resurrection.

We observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN.

Listen to the words of Christ. Listen to the voice of God.

Listen to the winds of the Spirit of God.

Stop, look and listen.

“Without Wax”



How sincere are you, really? How honest, dependable, and genuine? These are traits that shape our character and help others see Christ in us. The word sincere comes from an old Latin phrase meaning “without wax.” In ancient Rome, potters sometimes used wax to hide cracks in flawed pottery. Buyers would hold each piece up to the sunlight to see if it was truly solid and not hiding any imperfections.

When we allow the light of Christ to shine through our lives, it reveals both our rough spots and our strengths. The good news is that Jesus never shames us for the cracks; he restores us. As his light works within us, we grow into people of integrity who are whole, authentic, and sincerely his.

“The Upside-Down Blessing”



The Beatitudes are more than poetic lines from Jesus’ Sermon on the Mount. They’re a radical redefinition of what it means to be blessed. The Greek word makarios doesn’t just mean “happy.” It describes a deep, untouchable joy that pain, loss, or hardship cannot erase. As scholar William Barclay wrote, it is “the joy which shines through tears.”

Jesus flips the world’s idea of success upside down. The “blessed” aren’t the powerful or prosperous, but the poor in spirit, the mourners, the meek, and the merciful. Imagine reading them as “Congratulations, you who feel broken, God’s kingdom belongs to you!” His words assure us that, even in suffering, we stand in God’s favor.

Real blessing isn’t about shiny possessions or smooth sailing. It’s the steady, saving presence of God — a life preserver tossed to us when we’re struggling to stay afloat. And it’s not just an individual promise. Jesus spoke these blessings to a community, a we more than a me. Together, as the body of Christ, we find comfort, strength and the courage to live with joy that nothing in life or death can take away.

“Mountain-Top Moments”

In Matthew 17, we read a remarkable story about Jesus taking Peter, James, and John up a high mountain. What seemed like an ordinary hike turned into a moment that changed their understanding of who Jesus really is. Matthew writes, “And He was transfigured before them; and His face shone like the sun, and His garments became as white as light” (Matthew 17:2, NASB). The disciples saw Jesus in a brilliant, heavenly glory — a glimpse of his true identity as the Son of God.

But that wasn’t all. A voice from the cloud declared, “This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him!” (Matthew 17:5, NASB). Imagine the awe and holy fear those disciples felt. Just like many of us would, they fell to the ground, overwhelmed by God’s presence. Yet Jesus didn’t leave them trembling. He came close, touched them and said those comforting words we all long to hear: “Do not be afraid.”

After the moment passed, Jesus led them back down the mountain and into everyday life again. This powerful encounter reminds us that Jesus is truly the Son of God — radiant, holy and worthy of our worship. But it also shows us his heart: gentle, reassuring and near to us when we are afraid.

We may not stand on that mountain, but we can still experience our own “mountain-top moments” — times in worship, prayer or Scripture when we glimpse God’s glory in a fresh way. And just like the disciples, we are invited to rise up, follow Jesus and listen to him every step of the journey.

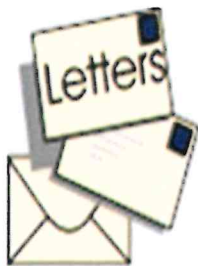

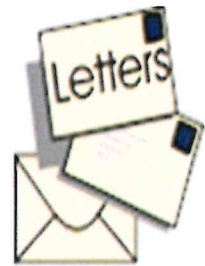
