







Congratulations Eric & Erica Van Surksum!

"A King in a Servant's World"

As Christians we proclaim Christ to be king and rightfully so. He is king over all creation and over us his people. Yet, we still talk about Christ being a servant in many ways including coming to earth as a baby, living a life on this earth and then dying the death of a criminal. This also is true as we can read about Jesus partaking in each of those moments for us. Yet when we proclaim these two ideas together, the world often scoffs. How can a king be a servant? How can someone in royalty take on the life of an everyday man? When we read about people doing this around our world people are shocked and stunned. "I can't believe he or she would go there, do this, or be caught participating in this! "Our minds cannot compute and do the math of high-status person plus everyday normal life equals reality.

Because of his willingness to become a servant, we now have the opportunity to interact with a king. Because of his 33 years on earth, we have gained access to a heavenly mansion. With his sacrifice we have been richly rewarded. Sometimes, even for us, the idea that the son of God came down to heaven to be one of us shocks our finite minds and hearts. How could he even consider giving up all that he did for us?

The questions may remain, but the reality stays the same. Jesus Christ came down from heaven not just for a one-hour visit but for a lifetime. He took upon the flesh of humanity and all that is involved with that undertaking and he didn't skip the hard stuff. 



It's Thanksgiving! Megan and Amira are currently together in Michigan as they set up home for Amira in Grand Rapids. Mike, Nico and Stella are nestled in Joburg. And our hearts are stretched over the miles with so much gratitude.

We celebrated an early Thanksgiving in Johannesburg on November 15. Anticipating it being Nico's last Thanksgiving with us in South Africa, we wanted to give him an opportunity to invite people who have been formative in his life to join us in giving thanks. Our time with friends-like-family prompted fresh awareness of just how kind and good God has been to us in 2024.

With friends from South Africa, Ireland, Congo and Japan, we shared around the table what God has done for us this year. One significant story of God's kindness came from Mosky. Often referred to as Agent M, Mosky has been living with us for the past year. Megan has been mentoring her since 2018 as she journeys to become a dynamic, Christian educator. Mosky's life can take wild turns, but God keeps holding on to her.

The day we met Mosky in 2018 was scary. It was her first time taking taxis from Pretoria to our area in Johannesburg. The plan was that we would collect her from the taxi drop-off area around 2pm. But 2 in the afternoon came and went and she didn't call. Then 3, then 4. Finally at 5pm Mike called her phone and asked, "Mosky, where are you?" to which she answered, "I don't know." After hours in the taxi, she realized she had climbed into one that was trying to human-traffick her. Using her wit, she escaped the taxi when it pulled into a gas station but now had no idea where she was in the city. Her phone data ran out so couldn't even check GPS. After seeking directions from others around her, she found the proper taxi route toward our home and Mike picked her up. Mosky finally reached our home at 7pm! We thank God for preserving her life that day as many women had been picked up from that area of Pretoria and gone missing.

Fast forward to nearly a year ago - Mosky had paused her education studies and was doing amazing work in an inner city outreach to support vulnerable kids in their own life and education. While loving her work, the year was filled with stressors. She prayed, asking God to give her a "boring year" - and the next day lost her job due to corruption which siphoned most of the staff salaries for the year. Not having a job meant she was also losing her housing. She felt a bit panicked and questioned God's immediate response to her prayer. How can this be a providential answer?

Meanwhile, Megan had just arrived home in Joburg after ReConnect visits in lowa and was doing her own praying, asking God to confirm her path in work for the year and how we should use the apartment connected to our house. Mosky and Megan were chatting back and forth about the unexpected turn and tough situation in her life. God prompted us to immediately invite Mosky to live with us. In Nigeria, we learned the phrase and experienced the belief over and over that "we have an on-time God."

During our early Thanksgiving celebration, it was reassuring to look back at how God has taken care of all of us throughout 2024. Mosky moving into the house has been such a taste of goodness for all of us. Our shared living has turned into shared work and so much shared joy. She has resumed her studies in education, found temporary work to carry her through the year and is now teaching alongside Megan, integrating God's sacred design for life with therapeutic photography. We could have never imagined the joyful life and meaningful work ahead of us when we were praying back in January.



Strong, Godly Families - launching in Nigeria!

Megan and Sarah Aderemi, Resonate colleague in Nigeria, have been meeting virtually to give life to a program God planted in Megan's heart several years ago. The Family Strengths Photo Program weaves together content from the book *The Spiritually Vibrant Home*, family strengths research, and God's plan for households to flourish. Families will create a family photo album by taking photos and writing about their strengths with the hope of celebrating and documenting the strengths God has given them, while also strengthening families. Megan hopes to pilot the program in South Africa in the new year. Sarah launched her pilot program in Lagos two weeks ago! Please be praying for the men and women who have just begun this journey. Our hearts are full of anticipation for how God will use this to strengthen families and make them beacons of light in their communities!



Our second great hope is in Christ the King returning soon to judge the living [and] the dead and establish the new heaven and earth where the righteous dwell. "Sandwiched between these two great hopes is our small hope, our lesser hope, our hope for tomorrow, our hope that we might begin to love and serve our neighbor and do some little something to bless the people around us," Wolfmueller continues. "This is the hope that energizes our vocations, that motivates our love, and that is the reason we make New Year's resolutions. We hope that we might do something a little bit better tomorrow than we did yesterday."

The pastor concludes, "If this was our only hope, it would be despair. But sandwiched between the love of Christ and the joy of the resurrection, this little hope is wonderful, and certainly not to be despised."

"When Life Gets Out of Control"

In September 2024, a North Dakota teen's car malfunctioned, becoming unstoppable and reaching 113 miles per hour. For 40 minutes, 18-year-old Sam navigated a bridge into Minnesota, intersections with train tracks and highways, small towns and — almost — the road's dead end.

But after Sam called his mom and 911, multiple first responders gathered. Police drove near him, staying on the phone and calmly asking about the accelerator, emergency brake and remaining gas. Ambulance crews were ready. The highway patrol laid speed sticks to puncture the tires (it didn't work) and cleared intersections ahead of the runaway vehicle. All the while, Sam's mom prayed. Finally, an officer sped ahead so Sam could run into his squad car, bringing his own to a halt.

Not making light of what could have turned tragic, sometimes our lives get out of control too. We speed through work, school, relationships, parenting — trying to accomplish, achieve and gain faster than others. We cram as much in each day as possible, seemingly unable to slow down. The harried pace can endanger our physical, mental and spiritual health.

Often, we're "saved" only as people who care come alongside us to help. Perhaps family members express concern, professionals suggest remedies, loved ones pray for us. Finally, when all we can do is crash into the loving care of God, we come to rest. It may take time to recover emotionally, to dare get back "behind the wheel," to trust life to carry us at a safe speed again. But thanks be to God for placing support systems around us when we need them most.
