

From Pastor's Desk

"Synod Recap"

Thank you for all the prayers and texts during Synod this year. The battle was strong behind the scenes and in moments when the cameras were off. We praise the Lord that during viewed events most of the discussion was in line with God's Word other than notable exceptions that have been mentioned in other mediums.

The number one question that I receive in returning home is how did Synod go? I would describe Synod with an overall score of 86%. Passing marks with more to do.

But in the last three years, Synod has been gathering all the agencies and institutions, churches and pastors into the same harbor. Now this Synod finally has all in the fleet pointed the same direction and by God's grace now will truly work together for the blessing of the kingdom.

Below are some of the items that were talked thru and worked on.

1. Ecumenical Relationships

- RCA put on a five year draw down of our "in communion" status, encouraging no new joint ministries to begin.
 - All RCA ministers serving in CRC churches will now be required to sign the covenant of office bearers yearly at classis.
- Provisional approval for fellowship with the Alliance of Reformed Churches, contingent on their positive response to the CRCNA's invitation.

2. Seminary & University Reports

- Calvin Theological Seminary: Synod wholeheartedly approved the appointments of Dr. Jessica Joustra and Jaren Mickelson to open systematic theology positions.
 - Calvin Seminary BOT was instructed to bring all institutional teaching staff in line with the confessions.
- Calvin University: Revealed rigorous new confessional-alignment policy—three-year mentoring for faculty, annual
 reaffirmation of confessional adherence, limited indefinite exceptions only after six years, and serious theological review of
 dissent.
 - Clarification was requested for what an indefinite exception would be and when it would be given.
 - Calvin made it abundantly clear that they desired to have a confessional relationship with the CRCNA.

3. Denominational Structures & Procedures

- Council of Delegates introduced an updated nominations policy; deferred further policy refinements related to Synod 2024.
- The Bible translation committee is not recommending the Easy-to-read version of the NIV for public worship.

Assisted Suicide Task Force with synodical recommendations received <u>unanimous votes that assisted suicide is a deplorable act and should be seen as outside of God's design and plan.</u>

Virtual Church Task Force. permitted further experimenting in an effort to understand use of the sacraments and church discipline in a virtual way.

Confessional Integrity & Discipline

Reinforced that office bearers cannot hold settled convictions opposed to CRC confession. All office bearers will sign the covenant for office bearers at each meeting of Classis.

Bi-nationality

• Synod emphasized cross-national solidarity with an overwhelming vote 171 for the USA and Canada to remain together.

Continue to pray for the CRCNA and for the Lord to raise up new leaders throughout the denomination to fill over 300 vacant pulpits.

"Tips for Gardeners"

"Love is to the heart what the summer is to the farmer's year," said evangelist Billy Graham. "It brings to harvest all the loveliest flowers of the soul." Without summer, our gardens would disappoint, and without love, our hearts wouldn't bloom.

The warmth of summer and love aren't the only ingredients required for abundant physical and spiritual crops, however. Discernment and persistence ensure fruitful yields in both areas. "Unless we know the difference between flowers and weeds, we are not fit to take care of a garden," advised Clyde Francis Lytle. "It is not enough to have truth planted in our minds. We must learn and labor to keep the ground clear of thorns and briars, follies and perversities, which have a wicked propensity to choke the word of life."

"Fixer-Uppers"



Summer is peak time for home renovations and remodeling projects. Those can be super stressful, starting with the selection of a contractor.

In a blog about her own family's construction plans, Laura Elliott explains the challenge: "It's not just any builder I want. I want one who has impeccable workmanship, is completely trustworthy and delivers our long-awaited [projects] early and under-budget." After sifting through bids and reviews, she discovered that most builders "look like they do pretty similar work for a pretty similar price."

For spiritual renovations, however, the choice is clear. "God is the builder of everything," says Hebrews 3:4 (NIV). Elliott writes, "Jesus is not only the builder of His Father's house, but He is the buyer, and the heir as well." And what he's building, she adds, is "a better Bride," his church.

Faith upgrades are an ongoing, lifelong process. "The renewal of our natures is a work of great importance," said 18th-century minister George Whitefield. "It is not to be done in a day. We have not only a new house to build up, but an old one to pull down." It's a good thing God oversees this project! ~Stephanie Martin
