

"Pray for Synod"

For this month's newsletter I want to take this space to request your prayers for our denomination gathering for Synod 2025 at Redeemer University, Ancaster, Ontario, Canada. Do pray for safe travel for all the delegates including myself, and vitality to all the churches in our denomination. There is a lot going on in 1100 churches in CRCNA. The agenda is nearly 500 pages this year and includes the following:

-- Task Force reports:

- 1. A definitive and comprehensive report on the practice of Assisted Suicide that is fully legal in all of Canada and in a small number of US states.
 - a. Sadly, this report doesn't go far enough in its recommendations, and it will take the work of Synod 25 to correct.
- 2. The report on the possibilities and parameters of a virtual church:
 - a. The question is, can a church solely exist online with no physical location to attend, pray, and most importantly receive the sacraments.
 - b. It will be the recommendation of our delegation that a virtual church can't be independent of a physical body, but that connecting virtually is a short-term solution when the need arises.
- 3. A task force assembled to clarify the nature and extent to which synodical pronouncements are settled and binding with regard to members, office-bearers and churches.
 - a. This report only muddies the waters further and will need to be sent back for one more year.
- -- **Standing Committees:** will report on the process of approving Commissioned pastor's contingent on their completion of the requirements for ordination. this conversation is needed. -**Pray for wisdom.**

The <u>Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations Committee</u> will present its response to our relationship with the RCA. They would like the CRCNA to remain in the status Quo. The EIRC notes "20 CRC ministers serve in the RCA and 46 RCA ministers serve in the CRC" and "there are nine 'union' congregations dually affiliated with both the CRC and the RCA."

-It would be our recommendation that we no longer see the RCA as a church in communion. But a church in partnership as we currently do with the PCA and others. -**Pray**

The Historical Committee has no significant item to synod this year other than appointing new members. Thankfully, there are faithful candidates.

-- Agencies, Institutions, and Ministries

<u>Calvin Theological Seminary</u>'s Board of Trustees will report that the seminary has never required its faculty to sign the covenant for office-bearers even though its students have been required. -**Pray that this will change.**

<u>Calvin University</u> Board of Trustees report will be given that they have a desire for a longer time to get their faculty in line with the denomination on Human Sexuality. -**Pray that this plea is rejected.**

- All faculty and staff will need to be aligned with the faith and practice of the denomination. This is the prayer request.
- The Trustee's are also out of alignment, and it is our prayer at this synod that they would realign the Board of Trustees at Calvin University.

Canadian Justice Ministries, Loan fund, Pensions, Reframe, World Renew have no recommendations to report.

<u>Resonate</u> is beginning to end some international ministry in an effort to preserve staff in the home office. -**This is a much-needed prayer request for a change of focus at Resonate.**

<u>Thrive</u> needs to be sun-setted as a ministry as it is disproportionately spending the resources of the denomination on overhead. -Pray that this agency would end well.

-- Overtures: these are communications from churches to aid in governing the denomination.

There are 30 overtures to read I would encourage each person to do so. We are currently recommending the following:

Yes -1-2, 4, 6, 8, 21-27, 29, 30 -Pray that all of these will pass with unified reports No: 3, 5, 9

7. maybe- but needs work

Communications: less weight than overtures, but seeking a voice


Accept: 5, 7 - Pray that these will be accepted. Reject: 1-4, 6, 8, 9, 10

Appeals: Accept #1. Reject #2: Appeal #1 is very important. -Pray the most for this one.

Esther was from Carmel and attended Rock Valley Community School. "We were in Carmel, and us girls would pile into a car after catechism and stroll down Main Street Rock Valley and look for guys," said Esther. "It was just what we did back then."

Chuckling, Gerrit shared that Esther always seemed to ask him for a ride home. "She always had an excuse," he said. "She'd say, 'I don't have a ride home. Would you take me home?'

The couple, now residents of RiverView Ridge Senior Living, recently marked 65 years of marriage by renewing their marriage vows. The celebration came to fruition due to RiverView Ridge's Dare to Dream Program, an initiative by which the facility's staff help to make the



dreams of the residents become a reality. Their daughter, Beth, sang beautifully as Esther walked down an aisle that was lined with flowers by a couple of Gerrit and Esther's friends.

Their pastor, Matthew Haan, opened the ceremony by sharing that the renewal of vows holds significant meaning in the Reformed tradition.

"In Reformed worship, renewal is often seen as a reflection of God's covenant with humanity," he said. "Therefore, vows are taken, often with sacrifice and commitment. And there are times in life when vows are renewed, and they are renewed just as seriously as when they were originally taken. Those can happen to mark milestones in life, after great struggle, or relationship moments of growth. As Gerrit and Esther reseal their covenant commitment to one another today and continue their commitment to one another, we are thankful for the fullness of their family, their children, their grandchildren, their great-grandchildren, and all the ways the Lord has blessed them."

After Haan shared a message with a few Bible passages that are meaningful to Gerrit and Esther, the couple renewed their vows to one another. After the ceremony, the couple celebrated the joyous occasion with friends.

Gerrit and Esther were married in 1960. During the first year of their marriage, they lived in Hull. Gerrit worked at Kooima Company, and Esther worked at a factory in Sheldon. They soon moved to Rock Valley and lived near Calvin Christian Reformed Church before buying a farm south of town.

In 1985, Gerrit and Esther, along with three of their four children, moved to California. Gerrit was in search of steady work, something that was difficult to come by at the time in Iowa.

"My son was in California, and he said, 'Dad, come up here. There's all kinds of work.' So, we did. We ended up in Escondido," said Gerrit.

There, life took a steadier turn. "I worked for a man who owned several plants. I stayed with him for 30 years."

Esther really enjoyed California, explaining that they made many friends and recalling their wonderful church.

The Kats moved back to Rock Valley in 2014 and have enjoyed their time back in Iowa.

Gerrit and Esther are extremely thankful to God for blessing them so abundantly during the last 65 years and shared a couple of simple pieces of advice - "Work hard, and you won't always agree with one another, but things will always work out," said Gerrit.

"Dedication"

When reading the story of Samuel from the Bible, I often think what it would be like to be dedicated from an early age for service in God's house. Then I am reminded again of the baptismal vows that were taken for me and for all of us and I can put myself in Samuel's place. Granted, I am not spending my days within the walls of the church, however I am spending my days in the place where God has placed me, the place where I can do the most work for his kingdom at this time. A year from now it may be a different place with a different job and a different set of circumstances, but for now I am where God wants me to be.

As we all live, work, and worship in the place that God has us, we also see the dedication that Samuel had to put to the task being in the service of God. His dedication extended beyond just a job; it extended to his following of God no matter the cost. This led him to confront fellow believers and kings. He had to tell Eli that his sons were going to be killed, and he had to take the kingship away from Saul. Each of these instances could have ended badly for Samuel but he went forward with the messages following God's command.

Do I have that dedication? Do we have that dedication? Are we willing and able to respond with God's heart, his words and follow through with his actions? That not only takes dedication to God, but it takes serious belief and trust in our heavenly father. I pray that in our lives we can begin to listen to and for God and follow through no matter the cost.

It may seem impossible to do, how can we as mere human beings follow through with that dedication and that commitment? Thankfully, we have someone to follow who dedicated himself to a path that led to our justification, our salvation and ultimately our opportunity to have eternal life. Jesus Christ dedicated himself to the journey of the cross, the visit to the tomb and the return to glory. We also have the opportunity to follow that same path, perhaps not to the extent that he did but with any number of hardships, pain, and suffering in between. Our human frailty cannot carry us rather we do so in the strength that we have found in Jesus.

We are called to continue our walk of dedication to our heavenly father and the work he has for us in the places where he has put us. We don't aspire to be Samuel instead we aspire to follow his example and live a life of dedication. It started up at the baptismal fount with our parents and the rest of the church taking commitments to be there for us. It continues with us, with the church universal, coming besides the next generation and our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ and "re-dedicating" ourselves to God's continued work. In that dedication, we live, work, and have our being, being ready to serve, ready to lead, ready to follow Christ, our brother and the kingship of our heavenly father.
